The Executive Director will be an inspirational advocate for Jewish youth philanthropy, with a passion for Judaism, and a masterful generalist with a can-do approach. The successful candidate will have a track record of effective leadership and management experience and will be open to and familiar with program development and scaling, field-building, and organizational partnerships. This individual must be motivated, dynamic, self-starter who can be creative with ability to execute on strategic plans and vision of Honeycomb. This is an extraordinary opportunity for a talented individual to take a solid organization and expand its reach to an increasing number of Jewish youth.

Reporting to the Chair of Honeycomb Advisory Board and Executive Vice President – <u>Jewish Funders Network</u>, this role will directly be supervising a current team of 3 professionals and will lead vision, strategy, and all operations for Honeycomb. The Executive Director will be responsible for visioning, budget, program development, evaluation, fund development, and oversight. The successful candidate will have the ability to develop strong professional relationships with key stakeholders, lay leaders, and program leaders.

Who we are

Honeycomb (previously known as The Jewish Teen Funders Network) is the leading resource for all educational content, resources and experiences to allow educators, professionals, parents and organizations to engage youth in strategic grantmaking. Honeycomb's vision is to create generations of engaged, empowered, and experienced Jewish changemakers and givers.

Honeycomb's strategic direction includes creating new resources, curriculum and training for professionals and lay leaders to engage Jewish youth in philanthropy. Honeycomb understands youth philanthropy as a vector to develop a deeper sense of Jewish identity, leadership, solidarity, and social responsibility. Honeycomb is a project of the Jewish Funders Network (JFN), an international organization dedicated to advancing the quality and growth of Jewish philanthropy.

- Manage \$1.2 million annual budget
- Raise awareness of Honeycomb and Jewish teen philanthropy through public speaking, teaching, and writing
- Manage staff and grow the Honeycomb team to expand capacity to support a quickly-growing field
- Ensure the financial sustainability of the organization, increasing both the development capacity of the team and increasing funds directed towards Honeycomb
- Cultivate, support, and work in partnership with the Honeycomb Advisory Board
- Develop and deepen partnerships with key stakeholders and partner organizations

- Self-starter with strong interpersonal skills, including the ability to communicate effectively (both orally and in writing)
- Capacity and proven skill in working both in partnership with others and independently to develop ideas and model initiatives
- Able to adapt to changing needs and to manage several projects concurrently while maintaining a high level of quality

- Willingness to "roll up sleeves" to manage day-to-day operations in a small start-up organization without dedicated support staff

- Passion for, and comfort with, Jewish Peoplehood and Jewish Values
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office Suite; familiarity with Excel required

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Minimum of Bachelors' degree or equivalent required
- Ideal candidate has a minimum of 7 years of relevant professional experience, including proven track record in scaling projects and strategic growth
- Experience in supervision, personnel hiring and training, budgeting and accountability for annual budget of at least \$1 million
- Experience in development, including planning, budgeting, grant solicitation, and financial reporting
- Experience working with lay leadership and staffing committees
