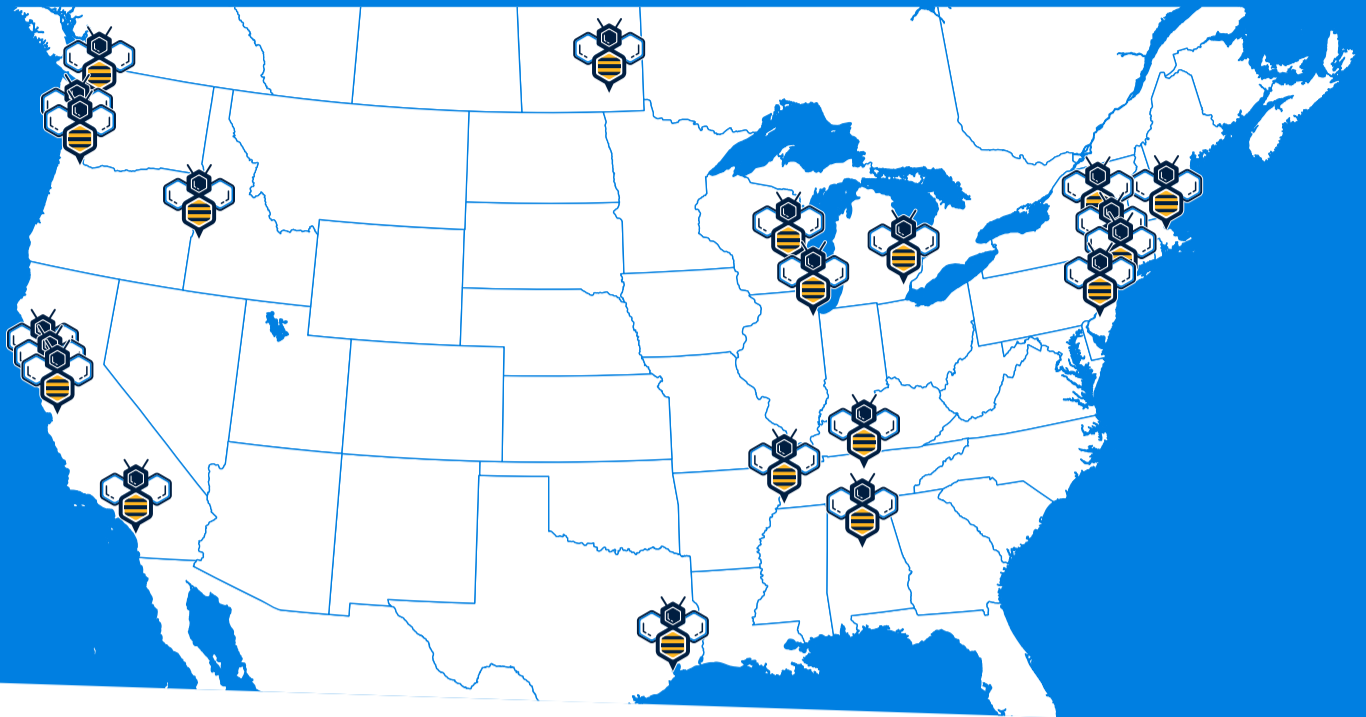


# Parents Reflect: Honeycomb Parent Survey

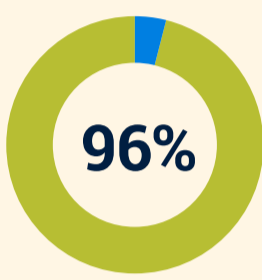
Honeycomb's 2022 Parent Survey explores the attitudes and priorities of parents to gain a deeper understanding of their perspectives, knowledge, and behaviors regarding their teen's involvement in Jewish youth philanthropy programs. The survey data provides key insights into families' Jewish engagement and philanthropic skill development.

Parents from across North America responded to the Honeycomb parent survey and represented a broad spectrum of Jewish affiliation.

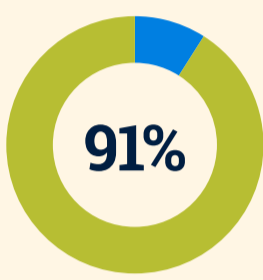


## » PARENTAL SATISFACTION «

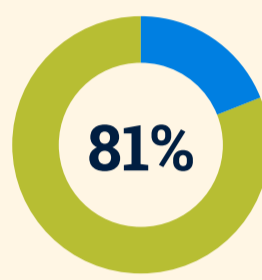
Parents with Teens in a Honeycomb Program:



said their teen's sense of Jewish identity was strengthened as a result of their participation.\*



were satisfied with the Jewish youth philanthropy program overall.

\* Jewish identity is defined by Honeycomb as a sense of Jewish Community, connection with *Tikkun Olam*, learning about philanthropy, and general Jewish values.



Parents say:

Parents say youth philanthropy programs were helpful in **ADDRESSING FAILURE, SETBACKS, DISAPPOINTMENTS, DEALING WITH SOCIAL ANXIETY AND PEER PRESSURE**. Importantly, this survey also showed that the programs help teens **UNDERSTAND AND ADDRESS ISSUES OF ANTISEMITISM** that they experience and see today.

## » PARENTAL PRIORITIES «

How did the Jewish youth philanthropy program help their teen grow?

- 96% of parents feel their teen is proud to be Jewish.
- 95% of parents feel their teen is now more connected to their local Jewish community.
- 92% of parents feel their teen has a better understanding of philanthropy education.
- 90% of parents feel their teen built leadership skills.
- 89% of parents feel their teen developed close connections with the Jewish adults who served as allies and mentors.



Parents find it important that their teens are inspired by the Jewish concept of **MAKING THE WORLD A BETTER PLACE** and they feel a **STRONG CONNECTION TO THEIR JEWISH HERITAGE**.

Parents agreed that their teens' **UNDERSTANDING AND ABILITY TO DO PHILANTHROPY** grew as result of their program participation.

**More than half**

of parents learned something as a result of their teen's participation in a Jewish youth philanthropy program.

**89%**
