



OVERVIEW

The **iGive LA** initiative from Honeycomb is a new immersive giving experience for youth serving organizations in greater Los Angeles. **iGive LA** focuses on helping Jewish youth create deep connections to Israel, build strong Jewish identities, and enhance leadership skills. Through direct funding in Israel, participants explore issues they care about, establish new relationships with the country of Israel, and engage with Israeli peoplehood. For this first of its kind initiative, Honeycomb has created a curriculum and set of resources that uniquely speaks to the Los Angeles Jewish community.

Selected Los Angeles-based organizations will receive full curriculum, in-person training, ongoing mentoring, resources, and some funding to launch this exciting program. Honeycomb will be accepting a limited number of organizations into this cohort.

PARTNERSHIP RELATIONSHIP & APPLICATION PROCEDURE

HONEYCOMB WILL PROVIDE:

- On-going programmatic support to implement the program.
- **iGive LA** curriculum and materials for organizations to adapt to suit their needs.
- Up to \$1,500 of funding to be used for anything pertaining to the program (grantmaking pool, program costs, staff costs).
- Evaluation measures and survey templates to collect effective data.
- In-person training workshops for program facilitator.

CRITERIA FOR ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS:

- Have leadership and organizational capacity to implement a successful and effective Jewish youth philanthropy program.
- Provide a dedicated staff member to plan and facilitate the program.
- Complete evaluations throughout the program cycle.
- Be committed to Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI).
- Hold 501(c)3 status.
- Participate fully in Honeycomb's **iGive LA** training, in person and online.
